Sakaw Askiy Management Inc. (Sakaw) and its shareholders are authorized to: establish temporary work camps to conduct forest operations on the PA FMA in the 2016-2017 operating year.

Location: various locations across the PA FMA

Area Office: Prince Albert Forest Service

Special Conditions: Sakaw and its shareholders are accountable for all activities carried out at any work camp covered under the authority of this permit. Sakaw must identify to the Forest Service the shareholder responsible for each camp prior to establishment of said camps. Forest Service Forestry Officers responsible for the PA FMA must be kept informed of all camp locations within 1 week of establishment. Sakaw and its shareholders must abide by: conditions Forestry Officers add to this permit; the PA FMA Standards for the establishment, operation and decommissioning of all camps; the “Conditions for the Establishment and Operation of Temporary Work Camps; and the attached “Burning Permit – Information Sheet”. A burning permit is required from April 1 until October 31 and all fires must be contained to burning barrels and only paper products are permitted to be burned. For any conflicts between the FMA Standards and the above conditions the standards supersede the conditions. All conditions set forth in the Sakaw 2016-2021 operating plan and approvals apply to this permit. Section 6.2.2.1 of the “Conditions For The Establishment And Operation Of Temporary Work Camps” is waived unless camp locations are within any “**shoreland development area**” as defined in section 2(r) of the *Shoreland Pollution Control Regulations, 1976*. Disposal of sewage at logging camp sites will be carried out in a way that contains the sewage (i.e. a pit) and is fenced or built in a way to prevent accidental exposure. All pits and/or containment areas must be filled upon completion of camp operations and carried out with camp clean-up.

Subject to provisions of the: *The Forest Resources Management Act; The Environmental Management Protection Act, 2010; The Provincial Lands Act; The Wildfire Management Act; The Public Health Act and associated Regulations.*
